SUMMER ENRICHMENT 2011

A summer enrichment program will be offered to students entering grades 1-6. Two sessions will be offered. The first will run from June 13-July 1 and the second from July 11-29.



The day will run from 9am till 3pm with childcare available beginning at 8am and again from 3-5pm. Opportunities for students to experience exciting enrichment activities in math, science, reading and the humanities. We will also offer fun, engaging elective activities such as gardening, arts & crafts and sports. This summer activity is open to all children in the community.

ONE : ONE COMPUTER PROGRAM

Anytime, anywhere learning is an educational concept that encourages a learning environment that goes beyond bricks and mortar. Thus, Saints John & Paul will be launching a new pilot one:one computer program for students in grades 7, 8, and 9.



Student will be issued a new netbook computer to use as a technological tool to enhance learning. The goal is to use technology not as an endpoint of learning but to integrate it into all aspects of the curriculum.

Students will have access to items they need to study on their netbooks at home, thus, there will be increased and equitable access to information, and students will be better prepared for college and careers.

There will be classes for 3, 4 and 5 year olds. A 5-day Pre-K class will be a new offering. All classes are half days with a choice of

morning or afternoon sessions.

Teachers are certified and follow a state guided preschool curriculum. Tuition options include traditional and co-op participation rates. Classes have begun to fill so it is important to register now.

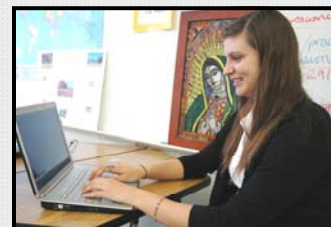
On-Line Learning Opportunities

On-line learning courses will be offered to Juniors and Seniors beginning in the Fall of 2011, allowing our students the opportunity to take a wide variety of new and exciting course offerings. Over 100 elective options will be available for students.

It will also enable them to experience an on-line learning course along with

the needed classroom support. Across the country districts are beginning to add this as a requirement for high school graduation. In addition, more and more universities are adding this strategy to their methods of delivery for college courses.

Honors and Advance Placement courses, as well as additional foreign



languages and other interesting electives will be available to choose from. Offering an interesting and challenging curriculum has always been a hallmark of the school's history.
